# CULTURAL PROGRAMMES SIGNIFICANCE OF *KALBELIA* FOLK DANCE

*Kalbelia is the* folk dance of Rajasthan. The traditional occupation of *Kalbelias* is catching snakes and trading snake venom. Since the enactment of the Wildlife Act of 1972, the *Kalbelias* have been pushed out of their traditional profession of snake handling and performing arts are a major source of income for them today.


